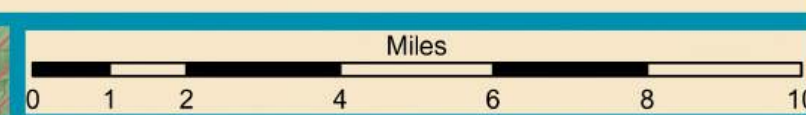

Permits/User Fees
Minimum trail use fee is \$10.00 annually. These annual user fees are used for the Snowmobile Trail Fund for trail grooming, parking area snow removal, and maintenance. Proof of payment in the form of a decal which must be displayed on the exterior of the snowmobile.

No Snowmobiling Areas
Please respect all NO SNOWMOBILING areas including Wilderness, all areas, and wildlife water catch basins. Respect access - Open access. Winter gear provides wildlife a source of food and conserve energy which can help them survive through the harsh winter months. You can do your part by staying clear and respecting, observing wildlife from a distance, not following the wildlife, and enjoying the view in the high country where you are the least visible.

The Continental Divide Region follows the Snake River Range and includes trail systems in the Snake River Range, Snake River Canyon, Snake River and Lost River areas, and to the South Lander to High Canyon areas. All services for the Continental Divide Region are provided by the Forest Service, including gas, food, lodging, rentals, and guides.

The northern part of the region consists of some of the best and most scenic riding in the world. The highest peaks in the region are located in the Snake River Range and the Snake River Canyon.
